Driving at Home				
30 Hour Log: Students must complete 30 practice hours with a licensed adult, in addition to 14 hours with the school. Students can track 1-hour per day The log is available for download under Rules & Resources.				
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ROAD TEST & DRIVER LICENSE

Eligibility Requirements:

- Students must hold the learner permit for 6 months

- Be at least 16 years old

- Complete classroom and driving hours

- Complete the Impact Texas Teen Drivers Program - Valid 3 months

After Passing the Road Test:

Students will receive an envelope with their documents and test results, or they can opt for digital submission for an additional fee. Once submitted to the DPS, either in person or online, teens will receive their Driver License.

DE964 CERTIFICATE - Obtained from the Driving School

Requirement:

Students must complete the first 6 hours of class and pass both parts of the permit test to receive the initial DE-964 Certificate required for a learner permit. After completing the full driver's ed program, they will receive the final certificate needed for a driver license.

VERIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT - Obtained from High School Attendance Office

Requirement:

This document verifies 90% attendance and good grades. Students taking a homeschool program will need to contact their administrators to receive this document.

Ineligibility for a VOE will delay the start of the driving phase.

SOCIAL SECURITY CARD

Requirement:

Only original cards are accepted; digital copies are not allowed.

PROOF OF RESIDENCY - Bring 2 Items

Requirement:

The parent/guardian taking you to the DPS will need their name on these documents.

All documents presented must contain that Parent/Guardian's name & a Texas residential address
